

THE SAFETY REQUIREMENTS FOR TRAVEL ON THE AWAR BETWEEN THE CHAR RIVER BRIDGE AND THE MELIADINE SITE

- ▶ If you do not follow the road safety rules, Agnico Eagle may refuse entry and may contact the local RCMP.
- ▶ Use of the road is at your own risk. Agnico Eagle is not responsible for personal injury or property damage on the road.
- ▶ Check aemnunavut.ca/community/roads/ to see if the road is open or closed.

Agnico Eagle may limit or restrict access to the road during periods of heavy mine traffic (e.g. during sealift season), when weather conditions are unsafe, if there are incidents on the road, during the transportation of dangerous goods, for road maintenance, or during caribou migration.

- ▶ Drivers under 15 years old need to be with an adult (at least 18 years old).

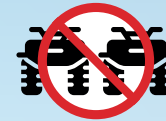
ONLY ATVS, UTVS, AND SNOWMOBILES ARE ALLOWED ON THE AWAR.



Wearing a helmet is required by the Rankin Inlet Hamlet by-law.



Vehicle headlights must be on at all time.



Vehicles must travel one behind the other, not side by side.

THE SPEED LIMIT ON THE ROAD IS 50 KM/HOUR. IF YOU SPEED, YOU MAY NOT BE ALLOWED ON THE ROAD IN THE FUTURE.



For your safety, when starting your journey from either Rankin Inlet or Meliadine camp, you must stop at the gatehouse to tell them your name, the number of passengers travelling with you, and the type of vehicle being used.

High visibility vests and buggy whips (flag for the back of your vehicle) are strongly recommended. Buggy whips and vests may be borrowed from the gatehouse and must be returned at the end of your trip.



The gatehouse is not staffed 24/7, therefore if the gate is closed, you may open it to access the road, and should close it once you pass.

Always let trucks and equipment go first and pull over when they are approaching you. Do not pass any vehicles on the road.



Always let wildlife (e.g. caribou) cross the road. Harassment of wildlife is not allowed.



When driving on the road, stay on the right side of the road, especially when going up hills and around blind corners in case a vehicle is coming from the other direction.



No driving under the influence of alcohol or drugs. The RCMP will be called if this is not followed and you could face criminal charges.



No hunting or shooting towards or within 1 km of the road or the Meliadine site. This is enforced by GN Wildlife.



Do not park on the road. You may use the shoulders (wider part of the road) that are found every ~400 meters along the road.



If you break down or need help while on the road, pull over using the shoulder and if you have a radio, call the Agnico gatehouse. If you do not have a radio, wave to another vehicle on the road and ask them to call the gatehouse for you.
