

REPORTING: CONTRACTOR LABOUR

All contractors working at Agnico Eagle's Nunavut sites have employment reporting obligations as per the Inuit Impact Benefit Agreement (IIBA).

Every month, Agnico Eagle collects employment data from contractors, including hours worked, number of Inuit employees, and corresponding job positions.

Contractor labour reporting allows Agnico Eagle to track progress and fulfill commitments towards maximizing Inuit employment across its Nunavut operations.

Improving Health and Safety Standards:



WHMIS is a comprehensive system for providing health and safety information on hazardous products intended for use, handling, or storage in Canadian workplaces. It is required for any employer where workers work with or in proximity to hazardous products to provide education and training under WHMIS.

In 2015, the WHMIS legislation was updated. All employers need to use the WHMIS 2015 by December 2018. If you are a business interested in updating or improving WHMIS training, you can view Agnico Eagle's WHMIS 2015 e-learning module for an example.
