MELIADINE OVERVIEW



▶ The Meliadine gold project is AGNICO EAGLE'S SECOND MAJOR PROJECT IN THE KIVALLIQ REGION OF NUNAVUT, FOLLOWING THE MEADOWBANK MINE.



▶ A 25-KILOMETRE ALL WEATHER ACCESS ROAD LINKS THE PROJECT WITH THE RANKIN INLET HAMLET



▶ On February 15, 2017, AGNICO'S BOARD APPROVED THE CONSTRUCTION OF THE MELIADINE MINE PROJECT.

THE ITIVIA PROJECT

To support the Meliadine mine project, infrastructure will be constructed in the Rankin Inlet Itivia Harbour area.

In the Spring and Summer of 2017, Agnico will begin the construction of the Itivia project which consists of three phases:

- PHASE 1** ▶ construction of a laydown area for the transfer of sea cans
- PHASE 2** ▶ construction of fuel tanks in the fuel farm area
- PHASE 3** ▶ construction of a 6 km bypass road south of the airstrip to Itivia

The bypass road will significantly reduce traffic in Rankin Inlet and thus will increase the safety of municipal roads and reduce potential dust generation in town.

Once the construction is completed, it will allow traffic from Itivia to bypass the Hamlet in delivering materials and fuel to the Meliadine site.





ITIVIA QUARRY

THE ITIVIA QUARRY IS LOCATED ON ELEVATED BEDROCK IN THE SOUTHERN PORTION OF THE RANKIN INLET COMMUNITY.

Agnico Eagle proposes to extract material from the existing Itivia Quarry to build the fuel farm, the laydown area and the Rankin Inlet bypass road.

Initially, site clearing, soil stripping and storage will launch the operation phase of the quarry. Due to the narrow footprint area, effects are anticipated to be minimal.
