

Appendix E: 2023 Windy Camp Reclamation Summary

Windy Camp Reclamation – 2023 Update

Agnico Eagle began work in 2022 to dismantle the old Windy Camp site at the Hope Bay Mine complex and a summary of the reclamation work was provided in the 2022 annual report.

This memorandum and associated photographs provide a further update on the reclamation activities completed in August and September of 2023. Reclamation activities focused on clean-up of remaining debris and equipment, and fixing erosion issues along the shoreline.

In total, five sea containers were filled with debris from clean-up of the remaining infrastructure at the camp, for a total weight of 35.6 tonnes. The sea containers were then transported to the Roberts Bay laydown area. The Weatherhaven shell was partially removed, and the structure remains to be dismantled which is scheduled for the summer of 2024.

Affected areas of erosion gullies along the shore to the north and south of Windy Camp were filled in and erosion blankets were placed to prevent further damage to the shoreline.

Looking ahead, Agnico Eagle plans to update the site assessment to confirm soil conditions from previous activities at the camp. The site assessment will help indicate whether further rehabilitation is required (e.g., soil excavation) or if the reclamation activities are complete.
