Spill Description

During operations at the Whale Tail Mine, a loader operator was collecting a tote of windshield washer fluid from outside the warehouse. The loader's forks punctured the reservoir resulting in its contents being empty onto the ground.



Spill Location: Northing: N65°24'05.54" W96°40'27.08" on IOL

There were no off-site impacts or discharges. Distance to the closest water body is 650M to Whale Tail South Lake.

Cause of Spill

Punctured tote caused by misalignment of the equipment forks.

Remediation Actions

A loader with a bucket was immediately used to scrape the area clean. Approximately 10m3 of contaminated snow and material was collected and will be disposed at the Meadowbank tailings storage facility.





Corrective measures

A job task observation (JTO) of the operation was performed to identify the environmental and health & safety risks associated to the task. Following the JTO, the procedure will be adapted to require the use of a spotter when manipulating a tote with the loader.

While travelling southbound of the Whale Tail Haul Road, a Long-Haul Truck broke down at km 136.7. The operator stopped the equipment on the side of the road to inspect the damage. During the assessment, the driver notified that a mechanical part had punctured the fuel tank.

There were no off-site impacts or discharges. Distance to the closest water body is 360m to Pipe Dream Lake


Cause of Spill

Equipment Failure

Remediation Actions

The environment and maintenance department were immediately called. A secondary containment was placed under the leak and absorbent material was deployed on the contaminated surface. The spilled diesel fuel was contained within the road footprint.

Approximately 3 m³ of contaminated material was picked up and brought to the Meadowbank landfarm. The contaminated absorbent material was collected and disposed of at the Hazmat facility.



Corrective measures

A routine visual inspection of all systems is performed during pre-operation checks as a part of the preventative maintenance program.

Please find the following information as a follow up to the Spill report submitted February 24th, 2023, by Agnico Eagle Meadowbank division. This detailed report is submitted to the Inspector in compliance with the conditions under the Nunavut Water Board License 2AM-WTP1830, Part H, Item 8c.

Spill Description

During operations at the Whale Tail Mine, a drum containing 205L of hydraulic oil was punctured by the equipment forks while manipulating the pallet of barrels inside a sea can. Ultimately, a portion of the oil seeped through the floor and leaked onto the ground of the warehouse pad.



Spill Location: 65°24'1.16"N 96°40'28.24"W on IOL

There were no off-site impacts or discharges. Distance to the closest water body is 400M to lake A55.

Cause of Spill

Punctured drum caused by the equipment forks.

Remediation Actions

The sea can was immediately removed from the area and equipment was called to initiate the clean-up. Approximately 4 m3 of contaminated snow and material will be collected and disposed of at the Whale Tail Mine landfarm.



Corrective measures

The procedure for handling of totes and drums is in the process of being updated and will be shared with all departments that manipulate totes and drums. A new camera system has been installed on equipment forks and its process is still being optimized.

Closure

During operations at the Whale Tail Mine, a loader operator was placing waste oil totes into a seacan when they noticed the corners of both totes were leaking onto the ground.

There were no off-site impacts or discharges. Distance to the closest water body is 420M to lake A55.

Cause of Spill

Punctured/damaged tote caused by the equipment forks.

Remediation Actions

The totes were immediately removed from the area and placed onto secondary containment. Absorbent material was placed on the contaminated surfaces and a loader was used to scrap the area clean. Approximately 4 m3 of contaminated snow and material was collected and disposed of at the Whale Tail Mine landfarm.



Corrective measures

The procedure for handling of totes and drums is in the process of being updated and will be shared with all departments that manipulate totes and drums.

During operations at the Whale Tail Mine, a worker was draining the oil from GENSET07 into a tote. The worker went inside the GENSET enclosure and when they returned to the tote, it was overflowing into the maintenance truck and onto the ground.



Spill Location: 65°24'24.23"N 96°40'53.11"W on IOL

There were no off-site impacts or discharges. Distance to the closest water body is 1000M to lake A56.

Cause of Spill

Human Error

Remediation Actions

Spill pads were immediately placed on the ground and contaminated surfaces. The tote was placed onto the secondary containment bin at maintenance. A loader was used to scrape the area clean. Approximately 4m³ of contaminated snow and material was collected and disposed of at the Whale Tail Mine Landfarm. Contaminated absorbent material was collected and disposed of at the Whale Tail Mine Hazmat.



Corrective measures

The work procedure will be updated to include a checklist for performing this task. Totes being used as a transfer container will require a secondary containment system in place. The procedure will be shared with all departments that perform similar tasks.

Please find the following information as a follow up to the Spill report submitted March 15th, 2023, by Agnico Eagle Meadowbank division. This detailed report is submitted to the Inspector in compliance with the conditions under the Nunavut Water Board License 2AM-WTP1830, Part H, Item 8c.

Spill Description

During operations at the Meadowbank complex, a Long Haul truck (LHT) was traveling northbound on the Whale Tail Haul Road and yielded right of way to a loaded southbound LHT. The operator of the northbound LHT was too close to the shoulder of the road and was pulled into the snowbank off the road. Upon investigation, a fuel leak from the filler neck on the side fuel tank was observed.





Spill Location: N 65'14'52.63" W 96'28'38.35"

There were no off-site impacts or discharges. Distance to the closest water body is 480M to an unnamed Lake.

Cause of Spill

Human Error

Remediation Actions

Emergency spill pads were used to contain the spill and secondary containment was placed under the leak. A team was sent to retrieve the Long Haul Truck. Once the equipment was removed an excavator was used to collect the contaminated material. ~48m³ of contaminated snow and material as collected and brought to the meadowbank landfarm. Contaminated absorbent material was collected and disposed of at the Meadowbank Hazmat.



Corrective measures

A standdown was held with both LHT crews and the Whale Tail Haul Road Procedure was reviewed.

Cause of Spill

Punctured tote caused by misalignment of the equipment forks.

Remediation Actions

A loader equipped with a bucket was immediately used to excavate the contaminated area. Approximately 10m3 of contaminated snow and material was collected and disposed at the Meadowbank Tailings.



Corrective measures

Checklist for performing work is being updated. Totes being used as a transfer container will require a secondary containment system in place. Tote handling procedure being updated/implemented. Once completed, the procedure will be shared with the appropriate departments.

A 20L pail filled with contaminated snow and ice was collected and brought the to the Whale Tail Landfarm. All contaminated absorbent material was collected and disposed of at the Whale Tail Hazmat area.



Corrective measures

The workforce reviewed the fueling procedure during a toolbox meeting and all drills currently in operation were inspected to ensure no defective parts were present.

During night shift operations at the Whale Tail Mine, a tote containing 1000L of hydraulic oil was punctured by equipment during the process of moving the reservoir, causing about 500L of oil to leak onto the ground of the service building pad. The tote was flipped over to prevent additional oil from leaking out of the container.



Spill Location: N65°24'21.8 W96°40'48.9"

There were no off-site impacts or discharges to any receiving watercourses. The distance to the closest water body is 950m from Whale Tail Lake.

Cause of Spill

Punctured tote caused by misalignment of the equipment forks.

Remediation Actions

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

All contaminated absorbent material was collected and disposed of as per the waste management plan.





Corrective measures

After conducting a thorough review of the incident, the crew was briefed on the situation. Subsequently, the operating procedure detailing the necessary precautions and safe distances to be maintained during the operation of the loader tire manipulator and the fueling system was reviewed to ensure that all personnel involved are familiar with these procedures and adhere to them strictly.

While refueling an underground scoop at Whale Tail Mine, the operator left the fuel line unattended to perform another task behind the scoop. When the operator returned from behind the scoop he observed the fuel overflowing, resulting in ~150L of diesel fuel to spill onto the ground.

There were no off-site impacts or discharges. Distance to the closest water body is 1000m to Whale Tail South

Cause of Spill

Human Error

Remediation Actions

The operator immediately stopped the fuel pump and deployed the emergency spill kit. The contaminated material was collected and brought to the Whale Tail landfarm and contaminated absorbent material was disposed of at the Hazmat.



Corrective measures

A comprehensive inspection was carried out on the breather and fuel system to assess their condition and functionality. During the investigation, it was determined that the incident resulted from the lack of attentiveness exhibited by an individual who failed to monitor the nozzle during the refueling procedure. As a result, the incident was promptly addressed by conducting thorough reviews and discussions with all crews involved in various rotations. The primary objective of these reviews was to scrutinize the existing procedure and identify any gaps or shortcomings that could potentially lead to similar incidents in the future. By doing so, we aimed to enhance the system's safety and prevent the recurrence of such events.

Corrective measures

A comprehensive investigation was undertaken to ascertain the root cause of the hydraulic hose failure. It was determined that the introduction of a foreign object, specifically a rock, between the equipment and the hose, resulted in the premature degradation of the component due to friction caused by vibration. These findings were subsequently communicated to all equipment users, with a strong emphasis on the necessity of conducting visual inspections following loading, in strict adherence to the established procedure.

During operations at the Whale Tail Mine, a haul truck ran over a large rock as he was heading to the stockpile. This cause the hydraulic hose to disconnect from the equipment, causing 300 liters of hydraulic oil to spill onto the ground at the Pad K.





Spill Location: N 65°24'29.76" W 96°39'34.05" on IOL

There were no off-site impacts or discharges. Distance to the closest water body is 740 m to lake A56.

Cause of Spill

Damaged Hydraulic Hose.

Remediation Actions

The operator promptly shut off the equipment and called a mechanic to fix it. ~5m3 of contaminated material was collected and transported to the Whale Tail landfarm for proper handling and disposal.



Corrective measures

A comprehensive review of the incident and investigation was conducted involving all crews. Subsequently, a reminder was issued to all crews that bumpers should be used to block any road or ramp instead of boulders.

There were no off-site impacts or discharges. Distance to the closest water body is 940 m to Whale Tail South Lake.

Cause of Spill

Human Error - Punctured tote caused by misalignment of the equipment forks with no spotter present.

Remediation Actions

Spill pads were placed on the ground and an excavator was used to scrape and remove the contaminated material. Contaminated material was collected and disposed of in the Meadowbank TSF.



Corrective measures

A procedure has been implemented on site since August 2023 for handling totes and barrels with forked equipment. A comprehensive review of the incident and a reminder regarding the tote handling procedure were provided to the crews. The operator received further coaching regarding the task and procedure.

During the refueling process at Whale Tail Mine, an operator forgot to remove the fuel nozzle from their equipment prior departing the underground fuel farm. The damage to the fuel line resulted in ~300L of diesel fuel to spill within pump shack and onto the ground within the lined area of the fuel farm.





Spill Location: N 65°24'25.54" W96°40'52.82"on IOL

There were no off-site impacts or discharges. Distance to the closest water body is 1000m to Whale Tail South Lake.

Cause of Spill

Human error

Once noticed, the emergency spill kit was deployed. The contaminated material was collected and brought to the Whale Tail landfarm and the contaminated absorbent material disposed of at the Hazmat.



Corrective measures

A comprehensive review of the incident and investigation, encompassing all crews, is currently underway. Corrective measures were implemented at the underground fueling station Wiggins fuel dispenser, which involved the installation of break-away fittings. This step was taken to mitigate the risk of any inadvertent fuel release resulting from hose tear-off incidents in the future.

Spill Description

During operations at Whale Tail Mine, a fuel truck operator was fueling Haul Truck # 7 at the Fountain tire parking lot and over fuelling of the tank resulting in a spill of ~200L of diesel fuel.





Spill location: N65°24'9.82" W96°40'47.10" on IOL

There were no off-site impacts or discharge to any receiving watercourses. Distance to the closest water body is 580 meters to Whale Tail South Lake.

Cause of Spill

After investigation, 2 circumstances led to this event. First the top cap of the tank was not properly fixed after maintenance of the equipment, therefore no pressure could be built-up to stop the pump. Second the fuel truck operator was inattentive while refueling.

A loader was immediately called to scraped up the contaminated snow. Approximately 3m³ was collected and brought to the Whale Tail landfarm.





Corrective measures

The refueling protocol was communicated and reviewed with all fuel truck operators. In addition, the fuel tank maintenance procedure will also be revised by all the maintenance team.
