## OPERATIONS UPDATE

### SEALIFT SEASON 2023

The 2023 Sealift Season began during the month of July. Agnico Eagle held community consultations in April and May to kick off the 2023 Sealift Season. There will be 14 vessels and 2 barges (total of 16 vessels) combined for both the Meliadine Mine and the Meadowbank Complex.



### CYANIDE TRANSPORTATION 2023

Every year the Meadowbank Complex and the Meliadine Mine receive supplies on their shipping barges, some of which includes hazardous goods such as cyanide. Agnico Eagle is committed to the safe management of cyanide which is why we have a special procedure for the transportation of this material.

As part of this procedure, the road will be closed to the public during convoy transportation of cyanide. Once the convoy reaches a safe distance on its way back to the mine site, the road will reopen for public use.

For the Meliadine Mine, as a safety precaution, the material will be transported as a convoy in vehicles that will travel at slow speeds from the Itivia laydown area through to the by-pass road that goes around the community before joining the Meliadine All-Weather Access Road (AWAR) to camp. The convoy will not pass through town.



For the Meadowbank Complex, a convoy of vehicles will transport the material at slow speeds. The convoy will start from the unloading dock to the “Y” before joining the Meadowbank All-Weather Access Road (AWAR) to continue to camp. The convoy will not pass through town.

We anticipate cyanide transportation will occur in September for the Meadowbank Complex and October for the Meliadine Mine. Road closures will be announced on Facebook and on the radio. Please note that we will be following strict guidelines to respect both the community and surrounding environment.

### CARIBOU MIGRATION AND ROAD SAFETY REMINDER

Agnico Eagle is sensitive to concerns about the caribou and believes in working together toward a long-lasting partnership; we recognize that caribou are an integral part of Inuit culture and need to be protected.

Agnico Eagle has developed Wildlife Management and Response Plans for all sites as well as the Terrestrial Ecosystem Management Plan (TEMP) for the Meadowbank Complex and the Terrestrial Environment Management and Monitoring Plan (TEMMP) for the Meliadine Mine. These Plans were reviewed and approved by the NIRB, KIA, GN and local HTO’s. The Plans are implemented by Agnico Eagle’s Environment department at both sites.



As part of Agnico Eagle’s protocol; caribou have the right-of-way on all roads;



The AWAR and the WTHR are not public roads and public traffic is not allowed within mining areas;




Traffic and mining activities are suspended when caribou are in close proximity to the mine site;




Hunting is prohibited within 1 KM of the AWAR and the project;



Weekly wildlife surveys are completed along the AWAR and the WTHR. Results are reported yearly to authorities and communities;

 All hunting activity must avoid shooting directly across the road;

 Shooting around the work area is strictly forbidden.



### WATERLINE CONSTRUCTION (MELIADINE MINE):

Meliadine Mine Waterline construction has begun. Waterline construction work will focus between the mine site (KM 30) and KM 15 of the AWAR, as well as between Itivia (KM 0) and KM 6 of the AWAR from March to October 2023.

## AGNICO EAGLE UNVEILS NEW INUNNGUINIQ PROJECT

On Wednesday September 27, 2023, at the Kivalliq Trade Show's closing gala, Agnico Eagle unveiled the company's new Inunnguiniq project, which will create partnerships with three significant community organizations and partners amounting to a total of \$5 million dollars.

One of the three partnerships announced under the Inunnguiniq project was a \$2.5 million funding for the Breakfast Club of Canada to provide all school children in the Kivalliq and Kitikmeot region of Nunavut with access to breakfast on every school day for a minimum of three years.

Inunnguiniq, which means "creating a whole human being," will also include partnerships with Iliitaqsiniq and the Arctic Rose Foundation.
